




VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES



UWF SUMMER FIELD SCHOOLS

Plans are underway for 5 different field schools at UWF this summer. After the May 19 ORIENTATION at UWF, 3 groups of terrestrial field school students will learn mapping, survey and excavation methods at Arcadia Mill Archaeological Site, the Mission site at Molino, on the UWF campus and other sites. The Forensic Field School students will learn excavation techniques as well as methods used to locate clandestine graves. The Underwater group will learn to survey using remote sensing equipment as well as underwater excavation and mapping techniques on sites in Pensacola Bay as well as those up some of the rivers in our area.
