

THE LUNA EXPEDITION: SHIPWRECKS AND SETTLEMENT

We always have a great program for the PAS annual Bar-B-Que and this year is no exception!

Since the discovery of the 1559 Emanuel Point I and II shipwrecks, underwater archaeology at the site has been ongoing. These sites have been the loca-

tion of many underwater hours of work funded through the UWF Archaeology Institute and grants several from the State of Florida. Now using a Special Category Grant from the Florida Bureau of Archaeological Research (BAR), excavations have continued through
