#### 2016 FAS ANNUAL MEETING IN JUPITER MAY 19-22

By the time you read this, a number of UWF faculty, staff and grad students are on their way to the 68<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the Florida Anthropological Society in Jupiter, Florida from May 19-22. Palm Beach County Archaeological Society (PBCAS) is hosting this year's meeting at the Wyndham Grand Harbourside overlooking the scenic Intracoastal Waterway. The FAS annual meeting will be held at noon on Friday. The Friday evening reception in Dubois Park is sponsored by the Florida Archaeological Council.

Papers and posters will be presented all day Saturday at the Wyndham. The banquet Saturday evening will be held at the Jupiter Lighthouse. Tours of the lighthouse and museum will be available during the evening. The Key Note Speaker for the banquet is Palm Beach County Archaeologist and Historic Preservation Officer Christian Davenport who has made incredible discoveries and advances in our understanding of the archaeology and prehistory of Southeast Florida.
