UWF FIELD SCHOOLS-SUMMER 2017

It is that time of year again when summer field schools are held. The kick-off meeting will be held on MAY 22 and **YOU** are invited to attend.

Students will arrive early to fill out paperwork, but the presentations about field plans begin at <u>9 am at UWF in building 13, room 230.</u> Excavations continue at the Luna settlement to study both the Spanish town and the remnants of Native American occupations which occurred before and after the Spanish settlement from 1559-1561.

Underwater students will be diving on the EPII and EPIII shipwrecks this summer. Continued sampling of wood and other special studies are planned on EPII. They also hope to be able to take pictures of the EPII excavated middle section. The water has been too murky the past 2 winters to get the usual clear shots while the weather was cool. Divers hope to locate the extent of the EPIII wreck and survey more targets identified during remote sensing last summer.

2017 FAS ANNUAL MEETING IN JACKSONVILLE MAY 5-7

By the time you read this, a number of UWF faculty, staff and students have participated in the 69th Annual Meeting of the Florida Anthropological Society in Jacksonville from May 5-7. The well-run meetings were held on the beautiful University of North Florida (UNF) campus. Sponsors were the Archaeology Lab at UNF with the support of the Archaeological Institute of America– Jacksonville Society. The Friday night reception was well attended and it is always fun to see friends from all over the state. Papers and posters were presented all day Saturday at UNF.

The banquet Saturday evening was also held on campus in a commons area with a deck overlooking a lake. The Key Note Speaker for the banquet was Dr. Jim Dunbar, an archaeologist with the Florida Bureau of Archaeological Research for 35 years and founder of Aucilla Research Institute, Inc. Dr. Dunbar has made incredible advances in our understanding of the Paleoindian occupation of Florida and the Southeastern United States. When sea level was much lower, the peninsula was much wider and many sites are now underwater on the continental shelf.

PAS was well represented at the meetings. Student members Christina Bolte and Jenni Baggett received awards at the banquet. Christina received the Dot Moore Student Research Award and Jenni received a travel award from Warm Mineral Springs/ Little Salt Spring Chapter of FAS to present her poster on Saturday afternoon. Dr. Elizabeth Benchley, Dr. Greg Cook and Jan Lloyd presented papers about the Luna Settlement and shipwrecks. Jen Knutson was elected to the FAS Board and is chair of the Education Committee. Dr. Ramie Gougeon is the new *Florida Anthropologist* journal editor for the next 3 years.

PAS members enjoyed the Kingsley Plantation tour before heading home on Sunday.
