# **Presidios of Spanish West Florida**

The membership meeting program for this month gives us a preview of Dr. Judy Bense's new book, PRESIDIOS OF SPANISH WEST FLORIDA. She presents an overview of the results of historical archaeological investigations of the four early 18th century presidio locations in West Florida: Santa Maria, San Jose, Santa Rosa, and San Miguel. She will share information about the early 18th century military and Native American settlements as well as the highlights of the Spanish cultural patterns and temporal trends in ceramics. #### About our September speaker:


Dr. Judy Bense needs no introduction, but take a look at her career.

Dr. Judy Bense in President and Professor Emeritus at the University of West Florida. She attended FSU for her Bachelors and Masters in Anthropology/Archaeology and her PhD from Washington State University. She returned to northwest Florida in 1980 and "walked onto" the University of West Florida (UWF) with the goal of creating a progressive and nationally respected Anthropology program focusing on the archaeology of West Florida. Working her way up from the bottom at UWF, Bense established the Archaeology Institute, Department of Anthropology, and the state-wide Florida Public Archaeology Network. Underwater archaeology was added in 1989, and by 2008, the UWF maritime archaeology program was a leader in Florida and the country. That year, Bense was appointed President of the University of West Florida, an office she held for nine years.

In 2017, Bense stepped down from the presidency and returned to archaeology to write a book synthesizing the three decades of research on the presidios of West Florida and prepare articles for academic journals on topics of interest to the profession. The synthesis *Presidios of Spanish West Florida* will be available in March of 2022 from the University Press of Florida and her first journal article on ceramic temporal trends at the presidios will be published in December 2021 in *Southeastern Archaeology*.

Dr. Bense has received many awards and honors in her long career including induction into the Florida Women's Hall, the Order of Isabella de Catholica by the King of Spain for advancing Spain's contribution to the Americas, the Evelyn Fortune Bartlett Award from the Florida Trust for Historic Preservation, the JC Harrington Medal from the Society for Historical Archaeology for lifetime achievement, and the Senator Bob Williams Award from the Florida Department of State for outstanding achievements in Public Archaeology.




