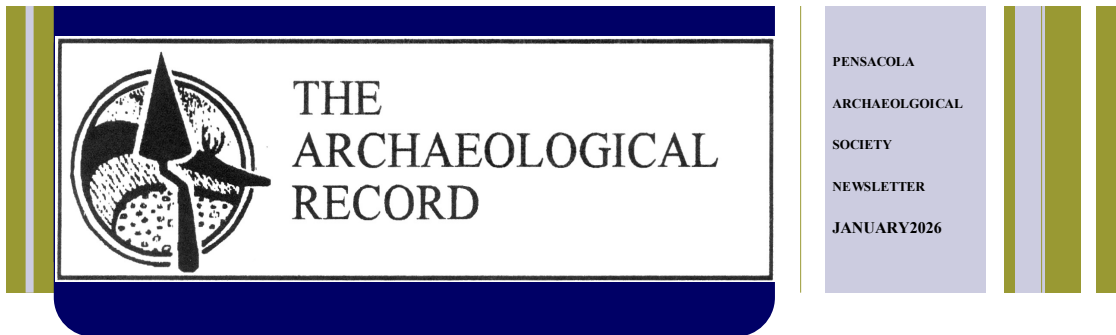

February 10 "The Road to Campbell Town" A reporting of the results of an archaeological and historical investigation of the French Huguenot settlement of Campbell Town in British West Florida. **Jen Knutson** USA Archaeology Museum Assistant Director

March 10 "UWF Archaeological Field School 2025" Faculty from UWF, Dept. of Anthropology will present some results of recent field-work, including new excavations of EPIII, the third shipwreck of Tristan de Luna's 1559 settlement of Pensacola. Conservation of materials from EPIII has resulted in exciting new discoveries. **Dr. John Worth**, Professor, **Dr. John Bratten**, Professor, **Dr. Greg Cook**, Assoc. Professor, and **Dr. Ramie Gougeon**, Professor and Anthropology Dept. Chair, UWF.

April 14 "The Epicenter of Escambia County Archaeology-It Ain't All in Pensacola" Neal Collier's interest in archaeology began after reading a Water-Powered Mill Survey by UWF's John Phillips in the late 1980s. Getting involved was the beginning of many a merry chase into the forests, creeks and swamps of the area. **Neal Collier** got involved with local history with the founding of The Alger-Sullivan Historical Society, wrote dozens of newspaper articles on local history, and was involved in publishing several books. He is a past officer and present Trustee of The Alger-Sullivan Historical Society.
