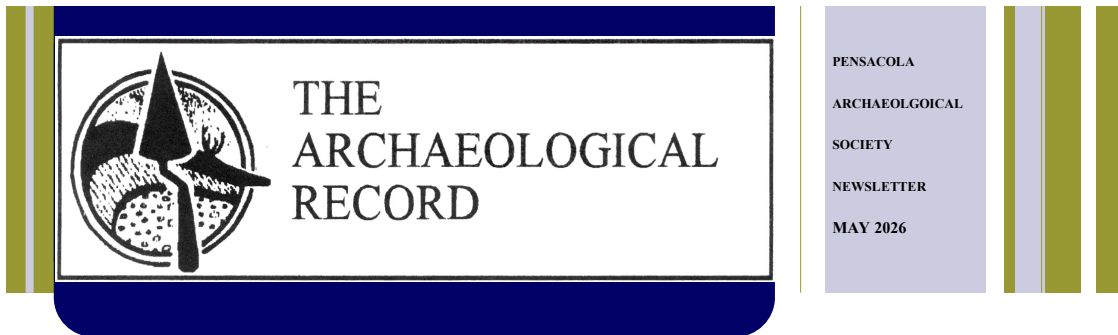

BEGINNING SEPT. 8, 2026 AT FPAN

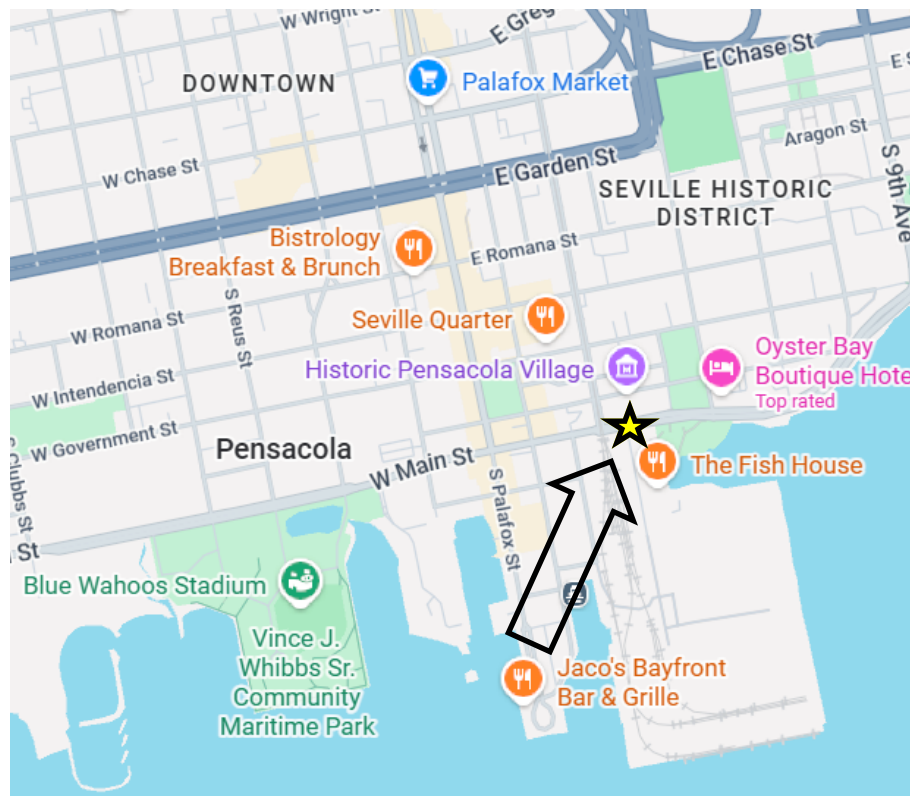

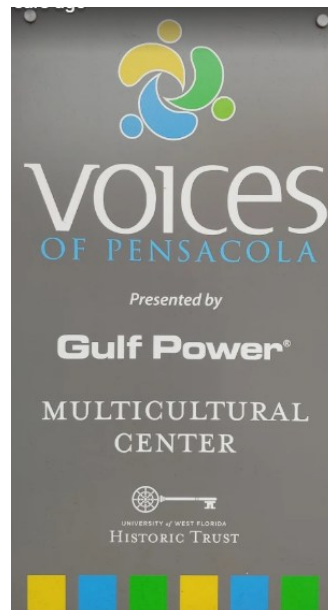
